Core Work Programme

- Delivered by two Primes (Ingeus and Working Links) in Scotland for the following customers:
 - JSA 25 and over who are 12 months unemployed
 - JSA 18-24 over 9 months unemployed
 - JSA who have recently moved from IB and are over 3 months unemployed
 - ESA at any time on a voluntary basis
 - ESA (WRAG) who are expected to be fit for work in 3 months

Work Choice

- For disabled customers who want to work
- Operating in four package areas across Scotland
- Provides Work Entry, In-Work and Longer-term In-Work Support

Help to Work Post-Work Programme

- Daily work search reviews – claimants attend the jobcentre daily

- Community Work Placements – claimants undertake work placements of benefit to the local community

- Mandatory Intervention Regime – claimants receive more intensive support from Jobcentre Plus advisers, aimed at addressing individuals’ specific barriers to work with greater flexibility as to the types of support offered.

Up to 12 months unemployed

Up to 36 months unemployed
