## Youth Employment Scotland Fund – Scotland's Southernmost Young Recruit



This is Scotland's southernmost Young Recruit Ewan Wright with Gallie Craig café manager Angela Sloan.

With the help of funding from the Scottish Government's Youth Employment Scotland Fund, Ewan has been supported into employment with Gallie Craig café through Dumfries and Galloway's Young Recruit programme.

Dumfries and Galloway's Employability and Skills Service work with a range of partners to provide a series of employability services across the whole of Dumfries and Galloway including supporting local people looking to get a job. Employers can access support for their business through D&G Employment TAP which acts as a Total Access Point for all employability services across Dumfries and Galloway.

Gallie Craig is situated on the Mull of Galloway and is the most southerly point in Scotland (further south than Newcastle). Gallie Craig near Drummole is an isolated rocky promontory on a beautifully coloured cliff headland and it is this famous landmark that lends its name to the family-run, cliff-top Gallie Craig Coffee House, operated by Angela and Harvey Sloan.



Ewan started on the 25<sup>th</sup> of March as a catering assistant on the Young recruits Programme and is delighted to have this opportunity, as travel has been a particular barrier, due to the extremely rural nature of the area. Colleagues from Dumfries & Galloway Council's TAP Service and Stranraer Job Centre worked together to help create this unique opportunity.
